

ST NICHOLAS PARISH CHURCH

St Nicholas Church is the oldest building in Stevenage. It is one of only two medieval churches in a town where most places of worship are less than fifty years old.

St Nicholas Church evokes many fond memories for those who have celebrated a wedding or baptism there. For others it is significant as a place of worship or as a resting place of loved ones in the surrounding churchyard.

There has been a church on this site since Saxon times. For over six centuries the towering spire has been a landmark for travellers on the Great North Road. The current church building has developed from 1100.

1100-1125 - tower built, probably at the west end of an existing wooden Saxon church.

1200-1300 - nave built, with narrow side aisles.

1330-c1450 - nave aisles widened, Chancel, Trinity Chapel and Lady Chapel built and a spire added.

1400-1500 - clerestorey added and roofs replaced. Rood screen carved and installed.

1841 - extension built on to the south aisle.

1980 - south aisle extension converted for use as a Parish Room.

THE PRIDE OF STEVENAGE

The church is more than a place of worship for its congregation: it is an integral part of the fabric of the town which many local residents value as an asset to the community. As Stevenage has so few historic buildings, a visit to St Nicholas Church is of even greater significance to visitors.

THE CHURCHYARD

The three acre churchyard surrounding the church is well worth a visit. There are several species of trees with some ancient yews and a fine row of mature beech. Also to be found are rare plants and some interesting gravestones going back to the eighteenth century.

ROLE IN THE COMMUNITY TODAY

Of course St Nicholas Church is not just a historic building, but the home of a thriving community worshipping God. On Sundays and weekdays Christians gather, as they have done for almost 1000 years, to pray in the name of Jesus for the needs of the parish and the wider world. Through its ministry, the church seeks to nurture faith, encourage discipleship and provide pastoral care for the church family and all who come. Through baptisms, weddings and funerals, it helps to meet the spiritual needs of the wider community and those who wish to mark significant moments.

ENSURING THE FUTURE OF ST NICHOLAS

The parish of St Nicholas is now only a part of Stevenage when once it covered the whole town. The congregation has to meet the daily running costs of the building as well as the much greater burden of maintenance and restoration. The church is an important feature of the local landscape and many townspeople would be saddened if St Nicholas' were to fall into a state of disrepair.

THE FRIENDS OF ST NICHOLAS STEVENAGE

The Friends of St Nicholas provide a means whereby anybody concerned for the future of St Nicholas, whether a worshipper or not, can contribute to the upkeep of the church for the benefit of the whole community. This is a Charitable Trust registered with the Charity Commission—ref No. 1006512. Its purpose is to finance the preservation and restoration of the parish church of St Nicholas.

Members will receive newsletters which will include details of associated fund raising activities. Open days with conducted tours of the church will also be arranged from time to time. In the past, the Trust has held annual gatherings to report on the work of the Trust and to thank donors for the generosity. We hope to revive this practice!
