**Briefing 82: Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2021.**

Dear Friends,

One down, one to go. Last week I, along with some 250 clergy from St Albans Diocese, attended a 3-day conference in Swanwick. It was great to be able to catch up with friends again and hear some talks by Paula Gooder, who is a lay theologian on the staff at St Paul's Cathedral. The theme was hope, and we were all encouraged as we studied the scriptures together. There were frustrations, and more worrying elements too, but those sadly come with the Church of England territory these days, but overall, it was a worthwhile time.

As you read this I'll be away in Leeds with Mike and Karen at the ReNew Conference, meeting with other evangelical Anglicans for encouragement and training. Such gatherings are a real joy, not just for the friendships and Biblical encouragement we receive, but because of our shared understanding of the gospel, our commitment to the scriptures and desire to see the good news of Jesus taken out across the nation. This is a true gospel partnership.

The need for such true gospel partnerships was highlighted just last week as the Anglican Church in Wales voted to allow clergy to conduct the blessing of same-sex marriages and civil-partnerships. Many of the clergy, including one of my closest friends, are now feeling uncertain about their future within a church which has so blatantly wandered from clear teaching of the scriptures. Do pray for them, and for faithful Anglicans in the Church of England, who may face a similar dilemma in the coming year or so. Right now, elections to General Synod are taking place which will go a long way to deciding the way those votes will go, so do pray that those who stand firm on the truth of scripture might be elected. Our unity and witness as English Anglicans, and as part of the worldwide Anglican Communion depends on it.

On to more immediate and local matters, with our **Harvest Festival** next week we're hoping that everyone will bring either some food donations and/or a financial gift as a token of our thankfulness to God for his blessings to us.

At **St Nicholas** the food will be taken to the FOOD SHED run by Vineyard Church, with financial gifts being given to The Barnabas Fund to support Afghan Christians.

At **St Mary's**, food donated will be passed on to THE HAVEN, Stevenage's homeless shelter, with any financial donations being sent to Rachael and Bernie in Kampala, so they can distribute them to those in dire need.

A reminder to that on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September at 12noon, there is a Thanksgiving Service at St Nicholas for the life of John Taylor - an active member at St Nicholas for many years and a former church warden and treasurer. Church family are invited to attend, and if you have a long memory of John serving here, I'd love to have some memories and thoughts from you. Please keep Roma and the family in your prayers, along with several others in the church family who are grieving after the death of loved ones.

Forrest Gump may have said that life was like a box of chocolates, but if that's so, then at times it seems like we're left with the hard toffee or the marzipan. (Substitute your own worst chocolate here.) But no matter what situations we face, Psalm 142 tells us that we can *cry aloud to the LORD and tell him our troubles*. And this is no one-way therapy session. The LORD loves us and knows us, and he also knows the right way ahead so that we avoid the snares that lay hidden along the path, and he promises to lead us safely through.

However you are feeling today; whatever situations have you confused or weighed down, let me encourage you not to carry them on your own but to take them to the LORD in prayer. He will listen to your desperate cry. He will be your redeemer, for he has promised that all things (eventually) work for the good of those who love God. Look to him as your refuge and your portion in the land of the living, and you will find your strength and faith renewed.
