Briefing 84: Wednesday 6th October, 2021.

Dear Friends,

October 10th is designated as **Safeguarding Sunday**, so we are taking this opportunity to thank everyone for all their hard work and time attending training or completing tasks that help to keep everyone safe. We also want to update everyone with what we do and why we do it and this should be seen in context of the national report into abuse and religious organisations which you may have seen in the news recently.

The Church of England Parish Safeguarding Handbook states: 'The Church of England is called to share the good news of God's salvation through Jesus Christ. The life of our communities and institutions is integral to how we address this task. The good news speaks of welcome for all, with a particular regard for those who are most vulnerable, into a community where the value and dignity of every human being is affirmed and those in positions of responsibility and authority are truly trustworthy. Being faithful to our call to share the gospel therefore compels us to take with the utmost seriousness the challenge of preventing abuse from happening and responding well where it has.'

The St Nicholas Safeguarding Policy outlines our approach to comply with the Church of England statement. The policy can be found on our website. Printed copies are available if required.

A key element in the statement is "... a community where ... those in positions of responsibility and authority are truly trustworthy." This we achieve by undertaking DBS checks (where required) and training as specified in the Church of England Safeguarding Learning & development Framework.

We are in the process of confirming that DBS checks and training are in place and up to date. In addition, we are confirming which members of the congregation are now supporting activities as there have been numerous changes since this was assessed, before the first pandemic lockdown.

The new Safeguarding Learning & development Framework has introduced changes that are being assessed. One change has resulted in most training being available online, with a limited need to undertake face-to-face training. However, some roles require more extensive training. The training structure appears unchanged:

Basic Awareness (formerly C0) Foundation (formerly C1) Leadership (formerly C2)

Those requiring DBS checks or training will be advised in due course. Please respond to requests as quickly as possible or notify the contact of any problems. Training certificates need to be provided to show completion of the course. The online nature of the courses allows anyone with an interest in Safeguarding to undertake the courses, particularly the Basic Awareness course.

The DBS checks and Safeguarding training may be similar to that undertaken by people as part of their professional life. The Diocese requires separate checks and training because of particular needs with the church. In addition, the requirements apply no matter how long someone has been part of the congregation or how well known the person is within the church. A consistent approach ensures that checks and training can be easily demonstrated, ensuring compliance with Safeguarding requirements.

The Church of England are expecting churches to be compliant with the new requirements by the end of 2021. The Diocese has introduced an online dashboard for each church to provide a view of compliance and any issues that need to be addressed.
