Briefing 92: Tuesday 30th November, 2021.

Dear friends,

We've got our first Christmas Carol singing this week. I've already had my first mince pie. And the Christmas decorations are out of the loft and ready to put up, probably on Thursday. Yesterday we announced our Christmas Carol Service plans to the world- the hard-copy leaflets to distribute across our parishes will be here by the end of the week- and over the next few days my task is to write my Christmas talks and plan the drama for the Christingle services. So, despite those headlines of doom about the latest variant, (don't the newspapers love doom!) Christmas is beginning to dominate my time. Perhaps that's true for you as well.

But as I said on Sunday, the focus of the Christian season of Advent isn't the countdown to Christmas, but on preparation for the return of King Jesus. The difficulty of course is that we don't know when that will be. We know He is coming. The Bible is clear on that. We just don't know when. And that makes living in the light of the return of Jesus harder. Harder, but not impossible.

Of course, if we knew the date we could make plans, use our time wisely, allocate our resources accordingly. If it was some way off, we could put a program in place to increase our witness and evangelism as The Day got closer, and make sure that we didn't book holidays or family gatherings that clashed! If it was in just a few days' time, we'd cancel everything and spend time in prayer and fasting, knocking on doors, telling everyone of Jesus' return and helping them get ready.

But we don't know the date, do we? So how might we live now in a way that shows we are increasingly clinging excitedly to the hope of Jesus' return? Let me suggest 3 ways.

- 1: Make sure we are ready ourselves. Jesus told lots of parables about people being caught out when the master of the house returned or the bridegroom suddenly arrived. In both cases doors were shut and people were locked out. Don't let that happen to you. <u>Today</u> is the day of salvation. <u>Today</u> we can come to Jesus in repentance and faith and ensure that our eternal destiny is wonderful. No one knows except God what will happen tomorrow. Jesus might come back. We might die. Use today to get ready.
- 2: Use your resources for eternal purposes. Over the coming weeks you'll hear about the poor state of the finances in both churches as the gap between our income and expenditure has grown. So, do our finances and giving show we are heavenly minded? What about our time? Many of us have full or part time jobs, many have family demands and it's right we fulfil them, and we all need time for rest. But does your diary show that you are concerned for God's eternal kingdom? And are we looking for opportunities to speak of Jesus to friends and family? You or I may be the only Christian they know. Are we willing to risk ridicule, shame or rejection to share the good news of Jesus with them? Are we living with eternity in mind?
- **3: Think about it.** On Sunday I shared these thoughts about what the return of Jesus will be like: *I imagine that like the disciples on the Emmaus Road, our hearts will burn within us. I imagine that like Anna and Simeon in the temple, we will gaze at Jesus and burst into songs of praise. Like long separated loved ones, I imagine that we will weep tears of joy, and like Mary in the garden, we will want to grab hold of Jesus and never let him go.*

I wish I could say that I have such thoughts often, but sadly it's the things of today and tomorrow, of this world and its pain and pleasure that so often dominate. Yet I know I'd be so much happier, I'd have so much more hope, and I'd be so much more motivated to live for Jesus if only the thought of his return was more often in my mind. I'm sure it would have the same effect on you too! Perhaps this Advent we might make that our aim.
