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Briefing 103: Wednesday 23rd February, 2022.

Dear friends,

Over the last few weeks, I've written a little about keeping going as disciples of Jesus. We thought about some practical ways to help us stay focused and to keep growing. We've been encouraged by some theological truths about God and over the last 2 weeks we reflected on some verses from the book of Hebrews. Since Lent begins next week, I wanted to roundup this short series with one final encouragement. Here it is.

Taking up our cross and following Jesus is often difficult and costly, but we do not do it alone.

As a child I was well schooled in country-western music, and one country-gospel song included this line: "You've got to walk that Lonesome Valley, you've got to walk it by yourself. Ain't nobody else can walk it for you, you've got to walk it by yourself." In one sense that is true about the Christian life. No one else can confess our sins for us. No one else can make a decision to follow Jesus on our behalf. And we each must decide to take up our cross and daily die to self and seek to obey God, loving and serving him and our neighbours with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. However, we are not alone on that pathway. And that's very good news, because we cannot walk it alone.

We have a living map: the Bible. How do we know the unchanging truth about God? How do we know how God would have us live? How do we know about the hope to which we move? How can we find strength, encouragement, wisdom, truth for our minds and light for our path? In the Bible! My friends, we are not alone in this life because God has spoken! He has revealed himself to us through his living and active Word, and so we can walk through life, no matter what challenges or difficulties we face, on a sure and stable footing. God's living map, the Bible, shows us how to live, and what a great comfort it is to those who take the time to read and meditate upon it! But there's more...

We have travelling companions: the church. During my vicar training I spent a day on Dartmoor watching Royal Marines recruits attempting to complete a 30 run/march each carrying, I think, an 80-kilo backpack plus a rifle. Each recruit had to complete this task or they would not qualify, but this was not a test they did solo: they did it with the same troop they had been training with all along. And not only was it a great comfort and encouragement to see others running the race alongside them, but they could also encourage one another when things were getting tough, and even stop to pick one another up if any stumbled. In the same way, God, in his great mercy, has called us not just to himself, but into a family of believers – into the church. And not just into the universal church, with people from many nations and languages we know are there but never see. God has also called us into a local church family, a place where we can see one another running the same race we are in; when we can encourage one another with our presence, strengthen one another with our words, and help one another by our deeds of kindness; even stopping to pick one another up when we fall down. The New Testament does not speak of any Christian living as a disciple of Jesus on their own. The church is a gift of God to Christians because it gives us travelling companions on the discipleship road. So, if you are not attending regularly, now is the time to start again! But there's more...

We have God himself with us: The Holy Spirit. Unsurprisingly, the disciples were distraught when Jesus told them that he was going away. But very surprisingly, Jesus told them that his leaving was good news, because he would send the Holy Spirit to be with his disciples for ever. When Jesus was on earth, he could be with his disciples only in one place at any one time. That was okay when he only had 12 followers, but today there are billions of Christians the world over, and yet each one has Jesus with them through the gift of the Holy Spirit. There isn't space here to list everything the Holy Spirit does in the life of the Christian, (I suggest reading John chapters 14-16 and meditating on those chapters if you want to think more about this,) but the Spirit is our comforter, and he helps us pray and witness. The Spirit helps us understand God's word and gives us wisdom. He fills our hearts with peace and assures us of God's love. He changes us into the likeness of Jesus and gives gifts so we can serve him in the church and in the world. So however hard the road, keep going, my brothers and sisters! For God is with us, and he's given us all we need!
