Briefing 104: Wednesday 2nd March, 2022.

Dear friends,

Lent begins today. Traditionally, Lent has been a time of self-reflection, fasting and prayer, which leads us to a greater joy on Easter Sunday morning. How? Because the more we recognise our own sins and failings, and understand that at the cross that Jesus suffered and died **for us**, the more precious the cross becomes, and the more joyful our celebrations at the resurrection of Jesus, for it is his resurrection that demonstrates that the cross worked! That our sins can be forgiven, and we can, through repentance and faith, have eternal life.

So, for the 7 weeks of Lent, these columns will be shorter. Each week I'll offer a passage for reading and reflection, suggest a couple of questions to meditate on and recommend a song to listen to. You may like to use them in one of your daily quiet times. But however you mark it, may this Lent be a time when the cross of Jesus becomes more precious than ever to us who have been purchased through the precious blood of Jesus.

A passage to read: Psalm 51

2 questions to reflect on: How deep does David's sin (and ours) go? David's attitude to his sin, and his attitude towards God, show us the right way to find forgiveness. What are they?

You are all invited to a special joint breakfast at St Nicholas Church on **Saturday 12th March from 8:30am.** We'll enjoy a good breakfast together (cereals, bacon butties, toast, drinks) and then gather as men and women to discuss restarting our 2 groups. There are sign-up sheets in both churches.

OPPORTUNITY OF THE WEEK: Stevenage has one of the youngest populations in the country, yet we see very few children and teenagers in our churches. We want to help remedy that, and we hope you do too.

How can you help?

- 1: **PRAY**. We can **all** do this. Pray for the children and young people you know, both in the church, along your street and across the town, that they might come to faith in Jesus and follow him all through their lives.
- 2: **CHAT**. Oak Church are starting a term-time after school club on Tuesday afternoons at the Thomas Alleyne's Academy, to befriend and encourage some of the pupils at the school who, in some cases, are finding life tough. There will be 2 volunteers from Oak Church there each week, we'd love to send 1 or 2 of our own folks to join them. Could this be you? If we have several volunteers this could be on a rota basis.
- 3: **SERVE**. Thursday afternoons from 2:30-4pm, we've been offering hot chocolate and biscuits to young people heading home after school, as well as dog-walkers and, well, anyone else who is around! Along with 2 or 3 others, you'd be making and serving the drinks, chatting with the young people and getting to know them so that in time we can speak to them about Jesus. Could you serve in this way?

If you're interested in either 2 or 3, please speak to Dave or Mike or Karen asap. A DBS check will be required but we can help you with that...

Would you prefer to serve in other ways? There are lots of opportunities to serve God's kingdom in our 2 churches—just speak to Dave or one of our Church wardens- or read last week's newsletter for ideas.
