Briefing 105: Wednesday 9th March, 2022.

Dear friends,

In previous generations, the 10 Commandments were recited as part of Anglican services; these days we tend to use the summary of the Law Jesus gave instead. Many churches still have them written on wall tablets to remind the people of God's commands. They may be ancient, but they are worth meditating on and learning off by heart, because as well as being God's commands, they are also the way to live the good and blessed life.

They start with the commands to have no other gods before the LORD and not to make idols of anything created. The blessed life starts here, because the good life must have God in his rightful place. If we crack this, then we will find that the other 8 commands are loved and obeyed more easily. But how often we fall at these first 2 hurdles! And how much do we need a grander and more accurate vision of God so we can see the folly of worshipping not-gods instead.

A passage to read: Deuteronomy 5:1-21

2 questions to reflect on: Today our idols are rarely little statues, but people, objects and pleasures which we run to for help or solace when life is tough. What are yours? How do the 10 Commandments help you see God's greatness and power, and his mercy for the Israelites, and for you too?

1: Quiet Evening Prayer: Continues tonight and for the 7 Wednesdays of Lent. Why not come along?


