Briefing 106: Wednesday 16th March, 2022.

Dear friends,

When Jesus summarises the whole law of God, he says that it means loving God with ALL our heart, soul, mind and strength... and loving our neighbours as ourselves. That's simple to say, but so hard to do!

In loving God, we battle with idols and distractions (see last week) whilst in loving our neighbour we battle with envy, pride, resentment and plain old selfishness. What's more, many of those sinful emotions and attitudes can also spill over and infect our love for God. We resent it when he blesses others. We get impatient when God doesn't answer our prayers our way, in our timing. We doubt his love for us. And so our love for God can easily grow cold.

As always, Jesus shows us what true love of God and neighbour looks like, and although the cross gives us the best picture of the height, depth, length and breadth of that love, the best definition of that kind of love is 1 Corinthians 13.

A passage to read: 1 Corinthians 13

3 questions to reflect on: How firm and strong is your love for God? How might you raise its temperature? How does your love for your neighbours (*neighbours in the Biblical sense!*) compare to the love Paul describes in this passage?

The BARNABAS FUND – one of St Nicholas mission partners, is also running an appeal, this time for these 3 items:

- a. tinned food (that can be opened without a can opener), cup-a-soup packets and energy bars;
- b. blankets;
- c. good quality winter clothes, particularly coats.

We'll be collecting these items for the next 2 Sundays- (and when St Nicholas is open for quiet prayer during the week) or until we have a large enough load, at which point we'll be looking for volunteers to drive them to Southill Baptist Church, just up the A1 past Biggleswade.

Thank you too to the 3 households that have offered to house Ukrainian refuges. I'm waiting to hear news from the Diocese of how this might work, but if refugees do come and live amongst us, we will <u>all</u> need to help and support them and those they are living with.
