Dear friends,

Through various means and methods, people through history have managed to tame a variety of animals, including many that are wild and ferocious! Yet James writes in James 3:8 that "No human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison."

Perhaps that description shocks you, after all, most of us speak kindly... at least most of the time. But hasn't it been your experience that harsh and painful words can sometimes come out just as easily as words of comfort and love? One moment you are praising God, the next you've said something to upset someone. One moment all is calm, the next your tongue has set your little part of the world on fire.

Perhaps that's why 4 out of the 10 Commandments (numbers 3, 4, 8 and 9) link back to what we say. And of course what we say flows out of the what is already there in our hearts. This week, why not keep a close watch on your tongue, and bring your failings to God in prayer, seeking his forgiveness and help in how and what you say.


A passage to read: James 3:1-18

**UKRAINE**. We are still taking donations to the Ukraine Appeal run by Samaritans Purse (the organisers of Operation Christmas Child). They have already set up a mobile hospital- details can be found here: <u>Samaritan's Purse Emergency Field Hospital Receives First Patients</u> (samaritans-purse.org.uk) If you missed the collection in church, you can also give via this link.

This week we delivered the first car load of food, clothes and blankets to a local **BARNABAS FUND** collection centre. But if you still have **TINNED FOOD** (that can be opened without a can opener), cup-a-soup packets and energy bars; **BLANKETS**; or **GOOD QUALITY WINTER CLOTHES**, particularly coats – please do bring them along to church.

As we wait to see if our three volunteer households receive Ukrainian refugees, we are putting together our support teams of those who might be able to offer practical help to host or guests. If you might be able to offer, for example:

- Cooked meals delivered to the host families or help with washing and ironing.
- Hosting refugee families for a meal in your own home.
- Helping with transport or taking them out for visits or showing them around the town.
