Briefing 116: Wednesday 25th May, 2022.

Dear friends,

Although Jesus spent some 40 days with his disciples between his resurrection and his ascension into Heaven, we don't have details for all of his resurrection appearances. For example, in 1 Corinthians 15:6 St Paul writes that on one occasion, Jesus appeared to "More than 500 of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are (at the time he was writing, obviously) still alive, though some have fallen asleep."

It's an amazing verse for two important reasons.

Firstly, because this is all we know about this appearance of Jesus. None of the gospel writers mention it and even Paul refrains from giving us many details. It's one of those passages that reminds us that however much we think we know about the life and works of Jesus; we still know just a fraction. But what we have been given is written to increase our faith and show us the certainty of the things we have been taught and now believe. That's where the second implication comes in.

Secondly, the clear implication of Paul's words is that if any of his first readers had any doubts about the resurrection of Jesus, they could go and speak to those who were there, and who had seen him with their own eyes. Some had died, including some of the 12 disciples, but many were still alive at the time Paul was writing and were real, living, first-hand witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus.

Ours is a sceptical world, or it is when it comes to things of faith. When people are faced with the claims of the Christian faith, they often demand a greater level of proof, first-hand experience or concrete evidence than they do for many other things they hold to be true. But when we are investigating historic claims, we can't expect the same sort of evidence that a court of law might demand when they look for evidence today. However, that isn't to say that there is no evidence. It's just different.

And here we have a giant piece of evidence, because very clearly, Paul is saying to those sceptics alive at the time he was writing that real, first-hand proof of Jesus' resurrection did exist. They just had to find one of the 500 people those who saw the resurrected Jesus and ask them!

On my first Easter Sunday here, we had a special visitor come to church. But before he arrived and walked down the aisle and shook my hand, I blind-folded a member of our congregation and covered their ears with headphones so they would see and hear nothing. But everyone else saw. And whilst my willing volunteer was reluctant to believe who had come in when 1 and 2 and even 12 people told her what they had seen; when the whole congregation stood and gave witness, she had no choice but to believe.

Jesus was seen by 1s and 2s and the 12 and then 500 people at one time. And if we had been alive at the time Paul wrote his letter, we could have questioned them ourselves. Instead, we have Paul's witness of what they saw and what he had seen. Evidence that proves that Jesus is Risen!

Are you convinced by that I wonder? And have you thought through the implications for you and all those you meet? If not, perhaps the 2 new courses on the opposite page might be a good place to start...
