## St Nicholas Stevenage Mission Action Plan 2022- 2024

Following a renewal of our previous MAP over the first half of 2020, the Covid-19 pandemic had a huge impact on the life and work of the Church. In the spring of 2022, the PCC prayerfully reconsidered our previous targets and have now drawn up this new Mission Action Plan for 2022-2024.



Our 2012 mission statement has been slightly adjusted, and our 5 aims opposite now sit under a new description that St Nicholas Stevenage is

a Bible-believing, Jesus-proclaiming, people loving community.

As such we remain **grounded in the Bible**, which we believe to be God's inspired, infallible Word. We want to be **greater in likeness to Jesus**, and are committed to deepening our discipleship. We commit ourselves to **going out in to make new disciples**, taking the good news of Jesus to our Parish, town and further beyond in word and deed to make new disciples. As God's gathered people, we want to **grow closer to one another**, building deep, loving friendships. And we want to do all, as well as we can, this **for the glory of God**.

In that context, the items on this MAP have been arranged under 3 main headings:

(1) The church as a place of worship, discipleship and learning.

(2) The church as a base camp for mission out in the parish and world.

(3) The church as a place of welcome for all in the community.

This Mission Action Plan was formally adopted by the PCC at their meeting in May 2022.

It will be reviewed annually and monitored at every PCC meeting.
