Home Groups

As we re-launch the Home Groups at St Nicholas, it has led me to reflect on the time I became a Christian and the question asked of me was, "Do you want to join a Home Group?" It seemed a good idea at the time, so I joined and I've been part of a small group structure for the majority of my Christian life, although they may have been called by other names, but they were basically a group of Christians meeting in a home, to look at the bible and how it impacted on our lives.

However, I think it's always good to look from the other side, so the question may be, "Do I really need to be part of a Home Group?"

In Christian life, we are born to be in a community and small groups allow people to have closer and more intimate relationships with each other. The main function of our Home Group structure at St Nicholas is bible study, this enables us to build deeper relationships with one another, along with accountability to one another and practical support as well as being able to pray for each other's needs.

To sum it up, I think in essence, small groups should attempt to imitate what Jesus did with his disciples and what the early church did together, which can be seen in Acts 2:42 "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread and in prayers." (KJV)

So, God wants us to be in fellowship with others who know and love him and want to follow him. On 17th September, there is a benefice breakfast at St Nicholas at 8.30am where we will look at Home Groups, what are your hopes, desires, and fears? Why not come along?

In the meantime, there is a list at the back of church for those who wish to be – or are currently - in a Home Group, it would be helpful if you could put your name on that list.

Interregnum Update

As Churchwardens, first and foremost, we would like to thank everyone for the help and encouragement that we have received.

Over the last couple of months, the PCCs of both St Nicholas and St Mary's have been meeting and we set up groups to produce a Parish Profile which will give those who apply to be Rector of the Benefice a "flavour" of the parishes and the lives of both churches. There have been 22 people meeting in groups and numerous others who have been inputting information and ideas into the Parish Profile which has enabled the following timetable of events, which have been agreed with the Diocese.

- The Parish Profile has been agreed in principle at a joint PCC meeting and it is in the final editing and proof-reading stage. There is a joint PCC meeting on 24th September when the Parish Profile will be adopted by both PCC's.
- Following the joint PCC meeting on the 24th, there will be a meeting with the Diocese, this is called a pre-vacancy meeting, and the Diocese will explain the process, particularly the interview process.
- The PCCs have agreed to advertise the post in the Church Times as well as within the Diocese and other websites such as the Church Society.
- The proposed dates of the process are -Application closing date to be 26th October, short-listing on 7th November and interviewing on 30th November.
- The interview panel will be: Bishop of St Albans, the Rural Dean, the Archdeacon of Hertford, Mike Wilton, Karen Walker, Eunice Sirkett, and Andrea Kelly.

Should there be a successful candidate, we could have a new Rector before Easter.
