Last Sunday we were able to announce the wonderful news that Revd Edward Keene has been appointed as Rector of St Nicholas and St Mary's and yet again yesterday we had more good news to announce that Edward would be Licensed as Rector on the 19th of June at 7.30pm in St Nicholas.

As wardens, we thank everyone so much for the part they have played in helping us to arrive to this point. We had 22 people helping us put the church profile together and 22 people involved in each of the interview days plus all those praying at the same time as the interviews were taking place. It really has been a time of us all working together. God has been so good; He is so faithful to us and has guided us through the interregnum. Please pray for Edward and Hannah as they prepare to move to Stevenage and for Edward as he seeks God's wisdom for the Benefice.

As we enter **Holy Week**, we rejoiced yesterday that the King of Kings rode into Jerusalem riding on a donkey, fulfilling Zechariah 9:9.

We have quiet evening services in St Nicholas 2^{nd} – 5^{th} April 7.00 – 7.30pm. Please come along to spend time with Jesus as He goes to the cross.

As we walk with Jesus this week, we can see how Jesus and the disciples shared their last meal together. The King of Kings washed their feet, showing that we need Jesus' spiritual cleansing, and we all need to serve one another. We watch how Judas betrays Him. The disciples are still assuming that Jesus will be leading some kind of

revolution or a takeover. But we watch in the Garden of Gethsemane as Jesus prepares to carry the sin and sorrow of the whole world on His shoulders and the disciples cannot keep awake to be with Him.

Please come and share a meal with us on Thursday at 6.00pm and the Maundy Thursday service at 7.30pm, for soon Jesus would be poured out on our behalf. Yet He remained faithful to who He is and what He came to do.

On Good Friday, we have meditations at 3pm at St Mary's. Come and ponder as we see Him pierced for our transgressions as He hung on the cross (Isaiah 53:4). Watch as they mocked Him; mockingly called Him "The King of the Jews" - but actually *is* truly the Messiah!

Although Jesus came to us in flesh and blood, in the end He was despised, and no worth was attributed to him (Isaiah 53:3). He suffered the agony of separation from His Father, as He bore the punishment for our sins. He let out a loud cry and breathed His last. The centurion witnessed His death and said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mark 15:37,39).

The 'good' in Good Friday is because He walked silently to the cross, like a Lamb to the slaughter, He was the perfect lamb without sin, not protesting the punishment that was given to Him. As the curtain in the temple was torn in two this gave us access to God and Jesus became the temple in Whom we meet God. Because of this we have hope. Jesus was rejected by God so that God would not reject us. As the promise given through Jeremiah put it: "I will be their God, and they will be my people" (Jeremiah 31:33).

Can you see as the centurion did, the truth that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and He has paid the price for our salvation? As we rejoice and greet Jesus on Easter morning, we can say without a shadow of doubt. 'He is risen indeed!'

So on Easter Sunday, come and rejoice with us at St Nicholas 9.30am or St Mary's 11.30am. Rejoice on resurrection morning. Ponder anew the deep darkness Jesus saved us from and celebrate the incomprehensible truth of what Christ's resurrection truly means: through trusting in Him we have been brought to eternal life.
