Dear friends,

July 2023

I am delighted to have taken up the post of Rector in these two parishes. Hannah and I moved down from Cambridgeshire a few weeks ago and we have been finding our feet in Stevenage. Within days of our arrival, major works began literally on our doorstep on the North Road, but we have survived so far!

Thank you to all who have helped to ease the transition for us. We are particularly grateful to the working party who came to the garden on Sat 24 June and did an awful lot of weeding and heavy lifting (including disposal of a dilapidated shed). You can come to admire the results of their work at the **Vicarage Tea Party** on Saturday 8 July, 2pm to 5pm.

Thank you even more so to all of you who have served the churches in new ways during the vacancy period between ministers. The churchwardens Mike, Karen, and Eunice have all shouldered particular additional responsibilities and have done so faithfully and energetically. Thank the Lord for those who take on those positions.

The Installation Service in St Nics on Mon 19 June was a happy occasion with many from the parishes as well as well-wishers from further afield in the building. The Bishop's sermon included a charge to me that the gospel of God's grace in Christ be front and centre in my ministry here - I shall certainly strive to ensure that it is.

I am beginning to get to know members of the two churches and will try to do so as fast as possible, but please bear with me in the meantime. No doubt it will help us to get to know one another if you can make it to the **Vicarage Tea Party** on Sat 8 July!

My first sermon was from Ecclesiastes 5:9 – 'this is gain for a land in every way – a king committed to cultivated fields'. The Lord Jesus is such a king – one who gives and provides for our essentials in life. He doesn't just live 'the good life' in heaven, but his eyes and heart are towards 'the fields', down here, where the ordinary people are.

As we follow the Lord, may we likewise be committed to 'cultivated fields' – not in the literal sense of all becoming farmers, but in the spiritual sense. This means looking out for others and tending to their 'essentials' in life, not least the ultimate need for peace with God through Christ. I shall certainly be committed to 'cultivating the fields' of these parishes.

In July and August our sermon series will turn to Ephesians, which should be a wonderful means of strengthening for the churches. There is much in the epistle about 'spiritual knowledge' – understanding of our state as Christians. May we grow in this week by week and so walk more closely with God and one another.

Meanwhile, church opening and door to door visiting will continue during the summer. Some of us may be away at times on holidays – if that is you then I hope you have a super break and are refreshed for life in the second half of 2023.

Before I sign off, did I mention the Vicarage **Tea Party**?! I do hope to see you there.
